HOME HEATING REBATES

Community Woodsmoke Reduction Program – Clean Home Heating Rebates

Breathe cleaner air in 2024 by switching out your old wood-burning stove for a new EPA2020/CSA-certified wood stove, pellet stove, electric insert or heat pump. Upgrade your heating and you could qualify for the following rebates through the Community Woodsmoke Reduction Program:

- \$400 for an Electric Insert
- \$600 for an EPA 2020 or CSA B415.1 Compliant Wood Stove
- \$1,000 for an EPA 2020 or CSA B415.1 Compliant Pellet Stove
- \$1,500 for an Electric Heat Pump

HOME UPGRADE REBATES

Planning home upgrades and looking for a break on the cost? As part of the RDN's action on climate change and environmental stewardship, rebates are available for climate-friendly home upgrades, with higher amounts for installing a heat pump, as follows:

- Upgrade to climate friendly heating \$400 to \$1,500
- Sustainable Development Checklist \$500 or \$1,000
- Fossil Fuel to Heat Pump \$1,000
- Home Energy Assessments up to \$350
- Graded Site-Cut Timber \$250
- Renewable Energy Systems \$250
- Residential EV Charging Station \$150

Rebates are first-come, first-served to qualifying applicants until available funds are spent. Apply early as funding is limited. For more information on the RDN rebates, eligibility criteria and how to apply, visit www.rdnrebates.ca or scan the QR code.
