



Previous Planning Work

The planning process for this neighbourhood has been under way for many years. Many planning documents and agreements have been completed and approved, as listed below.

Zoning for the neighbourhood has been adopted, and the Park Masterplan and Development Guidelines identify the land and amenities to be included in the regional park. The Phased Development Agreement is the legal mechanism between the RDN and the developer that outlines the strategy for phased dedication and development of parkland in parallel with land development.


