REGIONAL DISTRICT OF NANAIMO PROPERTY TAXES

You have just received your 2019 property tax notice from the Province. The Province collects taxes for schools, roads, policing and regional district services. The Regional District of Nanaimo (RDN) receives a lump sum payment from the Province in August each year. This lump sum payment goes directly toward the RDN services provided in your area.

The Nanaimo Regional Hospital District (NRHD) shares the same boundaries, directors and administrative staff as the Regional District of Nanaimo. The NRHD provides capital funding for:

- Nanaimo Regional General Hospital
- O Dufferin Lodge
- Eagle Park Lodge
- ✓ Trillium Lodge
- Oceanside Health Centre

Capital funding is cost-shared with the Province on a 60/40 basis with the NRHD's portion being 40 percent. Island Health is responsible for delivering health care services on Vancouver Island. Island Health pools both Provincial and NRHD funding, along with other sources such as foundations, to maintain, improve and build health care facilities.

The NRHD has adopted a 2019 budget of \$8.6 million resulting in a tax levy of approximately \$16.50 per \$100,000 of residential assessment. The 2019 budget includes \$1.4 million for capital equipment and minor projects, \$2.9 million for debt servicing on major capital projects and a \$4.0 million contribution into reserves to save for future projects such as a new patient tower at Nanaimo Regional General Hospital. Current capital projects planned include a new MRI, a boiler plant upgrade and an Intensive Care Unit redevelopment at the hospital.




