The Prideaux Street Exchange in downtown Nanaimo will be temporarily closed as the Bastion Street Bridge is closed for construction. A new temporary transit exchange (Downtown Nanaimo Exchange) will be located on Front Street by Port Place Centre.

To get to the Downtown Nanaimo Exchange, riders can catch the 40 along Fitzwilliam OR the 5 & 6 along Albert St. to catch routes 1, 7, 20, 204, 30 & 50 from the Downtown Nanaimo Exchange. 
