

## **REQUEST FOR PROPOSALS No. 19-076**

## Wildlife Control Services – Addendum No. 1 Questions & Answers

- Q1. Does the RDN have specific expectations for the presence of wildlife managers in each month and each day? Is the expectation that wildlife management occur daily from 0700 to 1730?
- **A1.** The expectation is that the contractor will provide sufficient coverage to manage the wildlife/birds based on the site operating hours and the illustrated varying annual populations.
- **Q2.** Can you provide further information on the presence of the UAV operator (days of operation, months of operation, and hours on-site)?
- A2. The RDN Drone Program is a pilot program with hours not routinely scheduled and based on staff availability and weather conditions. The RDN Team would work in cooperation with an onsite wildlife contractor.
- **Q3.** Can the successful contractor also provide UAV services or are these services meant to stay separate?
- As mentioned, the RDN will work in cooperation with site wildlife contractors and the methods they plan to employ.
- **Q4.** Does RDN staff cover the active tip face at the end of each day? If so, what material is used?
- **A4.** RDN: Daily cover is applied in the form of large iron panels. Intermediate cover is applied in areas that will not be active for 90 days.
- Q5. Does RDN have any specific requirements for the vehicles used for the project (e.g. lights, signage, clearance, 4WD)?
- **A5.** RDN: Contractors are requested to provide their own transportation. There are varying degrees of terrain and site access. A 4WD is recommended but not required. Site grounds can be reviewed through a scheduled site visit.
