

TRANSIT EXPANSION – JANUARY 5, 2020

This expansion will see an addition of 5,900 service hours to improve access for customers to connect with other communities and to Vancouver Island University, Cassidy and Nanaimo Airport. It will include the implementation of two new routes, route 8 Cedar/VIU will be connecting the community of Cedar to Vancouver Island University and route 78 YCD Airport via Cassidy/Downtown will be connecting Nanaimo to the community of Cassidy and the Nanaimo Airport. HandyDART services will also receive an expansion of 1,700 hours to help provide more service to customers. DRINKING WATER AND WATERSHED PROTECTION ACTION PLAN UPDATE

The updated Action Plan for Drinking Water and Watershed Protection (DWWP) in the RDN (2020-2030) is near final draft ready for review! After nearly a year of broad public engagement, in-depth committee workshops, and detailed compilation of community and technical input, the next ten-year plan for DWWP in the region has been endorsed by the Board in principle and is ready for final review.

2020 RDN WATER STEWARDSHIP REBATES

Help conserve and protect our shared natural resource and save money through these water stewardship practices:

Rainwater Harvesting: Eligible RDN residents can receive up \$750 for the installation or addition of 1000 imperial gallons of rainwater storage.

Irrigation Upgrades & Soil Improvements: Eligible RDN residents can receive up to \$475 for irrigation upgrades and/or 50% off garden soil improvements up to \$100. Receive a \$100 bonus rebate for completing both irrigation and soil upgrades.

Wellhead Upgrades & Well Water Testing: Eligible RDN residents can receive up to \$650 for wellhead upgrades or up to \$500 for the closure of any unused well. 50% off (up to \$150) a full spectrum water quality analysis is available to RDN private well-owners.
