STAGE TWO WATERING RESTRICTIONS ARE IN EFFECT

On April 1, 2020, customers of the nine RDN Water Service Areas began following Stage 2 outdoor watering restrictions. Stage 2 means that sprinkling can only occur on even days for even-numbered houses and on odd days for odd-numbered houses. Sprinkling is permitted for a maximum of two hours between 7:00 - 10:00 a.m. or 7:00 - 10:00 p.m. Vegetable garden watering and drip irrigation are exempt from restrictions. Stage 2 will be in effect until further notice.

TRANSIT

RDN Transit continues to provide transit service across the RDN. We have put measures in place to protect the health and safety of our drivers and residents including enhanced cleaning and disinfecting, restricting the number of passengers, and asking people to board and exit using the back door. Passengers with accessibility needs may still use the front doors. Please do not approach the operator. Customers who normally pay with cash or tickets will not be required to pay.

Buses are also limited to 15-20 passengers at a time. When a bus reaches capacity, the driver will turn on the "Bus is full" sign and will not allow more customers to board until the passenger number drops. If needed, a standby bus will be called to pick up waiting passengers.

NEW! - BUY EXTRA GARBAGE BAG TAGS ONLINE

RDN residents can now buy extra garbage bag tags online at www. getinvolved.rdn.ca/extrabagtags. Each tag will cost \$3.00 and will be billed on your annual utility bill.

For tags purchased online, there is no need to print label(s) to affix to your bag(s). Just set your additional bag(s) out at the curb. Your address and number of tag(s) purchased will be added to the driver's route list for your selected collection day.

Residents may still purchase physical extra bag tags at the locations listed at www.rdn.bc.ca/garbarge. The list is updated regularly to reflect only those locations that remain open.

REGIONAL LANDFILL AND CHURCH ROAD TRANSFER STATION

The RDN's solid waste facilities remain open, but at reduced capacity, with regularly scheduled hours of operation 8:00 a.m. - 5:00 p.m., 7 days a week. Residential customers should expect lengthy delays and note that weekends are typically busier. The two facilities accept debit and credit and the public is encouraged to use 'tap.' Cash will not be accepted at this time.

Commercial traffic is being given priority at both locations. Please ensure social distancing when interacting with facility staff.
