Gabriola's Skatepark Receives Funding

The Regional District of Nanaimo (RDN) has received funding to continue improvements at Gabriola Island's Huxley Community Park. The next phase includes construction of a skatepark and improved parking. Work is anticipated to take place from Spring to Fall 2021.

The skatepark project on Gabriola Island was first conceived of 25 years ago. In 2003, a community group was formed called Ride Free. They were committed to completing a skatepark on Gabriola and 15 years later, the non-profit Gabriola Skatepark Fundraising Association has carried on the legacy. In 2017, local riders and interested community members provided input into the design of their park and reviewed the draft design to make sure it satisfied their needs.

The <u>Huxley Park conceptual master plan</u> was approved in 2014. Phase 1 of the master plan was completed in 2017 including a new playground and new sport court hockey boards.

For the skatepark, the RDN has received \$309,480 from the federal government and \$257,874 from the provincial government through the Investing in Canada Infrastructure Plan, Community Culture and Recreation Infrastructure Stream. The remaining \$206,346 will be paid for through donations, reserves and taxes.
