


#### NANAIMO AIRPORT LAND USE BYLAW UPDATES

The RDN is proposing to amend the Regional Growth Strategy, Electoral Area A Official Community Plan and Zoning Bylaw No. 500 for lands owned by the Nanaimo Airport Commission. The Nanaimo Airport Commission, who owns and operates the Nanaimo Airport, has a land use plan that includes expanding the airport terminal and airside commercial for aviation and aviation light industrial, and developing land adjacent to the Trans-Canada Highway for commecial uses, passenger flow and parking.

The purpose of the proposed amendments is to recognize the existing airport operations and to facilitate future development of the Nanaimo Airport, including commercial uses complimentary to the airport on the portion of the property adjacent to the Trans-Canada Highway.

### NOTICE OF TREE CLEARING AND GRUBBING

Detailed engineering design of the French Creek Pollution Control Centre Expansion and Odour Control Upgrade, at 957 Lee Road, is nearly complete. Tree clearing and grubbing is necessary to provide construction access to the site and room for the plant expansion.


- Tree clearing will occur the week of March 8 to ensure that it is complete before the active bird nesting season that begins on March 15.
- Grubbing of the stumps will follow immediately after and will be complete by April 16.

Work will take place from Monday to Friday, 7 a.m. to 6 p.m. Residents can expect noise from chainsaws and heavy equipment during this time and, potentially, minor traffic delays on Highway 19A while heavy equipment is set up.
