Register for the RDN's Emergency Alerting System, Voyent Alert!



LAND USE AMENDMENT APPLICATION

Regional Growth Strategy and Official Community Plan Amendment Application No. PL2021-005

The RDN has received an application to amend the Regional Growth Strategy (RGS) and Electoral Area A Official Community Plan (OCP) for property located at 2935 Trans-Canada Highway.

The purpose of the application is to amend the RGS to remove the 'Rural Residential' designation and replace with the 'Industrial' designation on the entire property, and to amend the OCP to remove the 'Rural' designation and replace with the 'Industrial' designation on the entire property. If this application is successful, the applicant intends to apply to rezone the property to facilitate the future expansion of the existing industrial business.

A Public Hearing for the proposed RGS and Electoral Area A OCP amendments is being held electronically via Zoom and in-person on **Tuesday, December 7, 2021 at 6 p.m.** For further information on the project and instructions on attending the Public Hearing please visit: www.qetinvolved.rdn.ca/pl2021-005 or call 250-390-6761.
