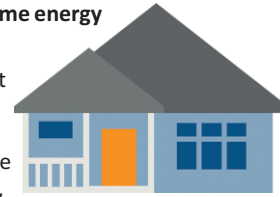

LAND USE AMENDMENT APPLICATION

Regional Growth Strategy and Official Community Plan Amendment Application No. PL2021-005

The RDN has received an application to amend the Regional Growth Strategy (RGS) and Electoral Area A Official Community Plan (OCP) for property located at 2935 Trans-Canada Highway.

The purpose of the application is to amend the RGS to remove the 'Rural Residential' designation and replace it with the 'Industrial' designation on the entire property, and to amend the OCP to remove the 'Rural' designation and replace it with the 'Industrial' designation on the entire property. If this application is successful, the applicant intends to apply to rezone the property to facilitate the future expansion of the existing industrial business.

WOODSTOVE REPLACEMENT PROGRAM

Got a woodstove? Take care of your neighbourhood's air!

Poorly managed or old wood stoves create a lot of smoke that can settle in your neighbourhood, impacting the health of your family and your neighbours. Do your part to reduce or eliminate smoke:

- ✓ Burn only dry, seasoned wood and a small bit of newspaper
- ✓ Replace your old smokey stove with a new clean burning option (rebates available!)
- ✓ Never let your fire smolder
- ✓ Take time to observe how smokey your stove is. Modern wood stoves, properly operated, produce next to no visible smoke.

REDUCE, REUSE, RECYCLE

Reduce, Reuse, then Recycle Right. Follow these recycling cart tips to keep waste out of the landfill and conserve resources:

- 1. Know what goes where**
- Products like clothing, electronics, books, toys, pots and pans shouldn't be included in your recycling cart.
- 2. Keep recyclables loose in the cart** - Do not stack items inside one another. Plastic bags don't go in your recycling cart.
- 3. Only put clean items in your recycling** - Empty containers and give them a quick rinse before placing them in your recycling cart.
