RGS AND OCP AMENDMENT APPLICATION

Regional Growth Strategy and Official Community Plan Amendment Application No. PL2021-043

The RDN has received an application for a minor amendment to the Regional Growth Strategy (RGS) and an amendment to the Electoral Area A Official Community Plan (OCP) for property located at 1329, 1333, 1340 Kipp Road and PID 026232391.

The purpose of the application is to amend the RGS to remove the 'Rural Residential' land use designation and replace with 'Industrial' on all of the subject properties, and amend the OCP to remove the 'Rural Residential' land use designation and replace with 'South Wellington Light Industrial and Commercial Area' for 1340 Kipp Road and PID 026232391. If the application is successful, the applicant intends to rezone the properties located at 1340 Kipp Road and PID 026232391 to facilitate the future expansion of their existing business.
