
NO MOW MAY



PAYING YOUR UTILITY BILL

The RDN issues approximately 19,000 water, sewer and garbage utility bills in May and approximately 3,000 water bills in September each year.

Pay by Credit Card – Now Available!

Link and register your utility account to pay by credit card (1.75 per cent surcharge applies), to set up electronic billing and to view your transaction history online. Go to <code>www.rdn.bc.ca/payments</code> for details. Existing E-Billing customers (signed up prior to September 2021) who do not link and register their account will receive paper bills.

Prompt Payment Discount

If we receive your payment on or before July 4, 2022, a 10 per cent prompt payment discount applies for the water and sewer charges and a \$15 flat rate discount applies for the residential curbside collection charges (discounts not applicable for Sandpiper Bulk Water surcharge). If a bill is outstanding at the end of December, the amount is transferred to the Surveyor of Taxes for collection.
