

ABOUT THE ROLE

The Regional District of Nanaimo has an employment opportunity for a five (5) casual Lifeguards/Instructors at the Ravensong Aquatic Centre in Qualicum Beach.

The successful candidates will assist in the creation, planning, organization, implementation and evaluation of aquatic programs and special events. Duties include leading and instructing a variety water-based exercise classes (i.e., Aquafit), enforcing pool rules and pool safety for the public, routine preventative maintenance and safety checks, implementation of the facility's emergency response program, providing first aid services and supporting office staff.

QUALIFICATIONS

Qualifications include high school graduation, with one year of pool/aquatic related experience, or an equivalent combination of training and experience. Applicants must possess and maintain the following certifications:

- National Lifeguard Award (Pool Option)
- Red Cross Water Safety Instructor
- CPR Certification Basic Rescuer or CPR "C" & AED
- Recognized First Aid Certification/WorkSafeBC Equivalency.

Strong interpersonal, communication and leadership skills. General knowledge of office skills including keyboarding, word processing and knowledge of computer applications are also required.

POSITION DETAILS

This is a casual union position. The (2022) rate of pay to start is \$20.66 per hour. Upon completion of four calendar months your wage will increase to \$21.75 per hour. Hours of work vary, and weekend work is required. As a casual employee you will also receive an additional 9% in lieu of benefits including vacation and statutory holidays.

JOB SUMMARY

The Lifeguard/Instructor contributes to the effective operation of the District 69 Recreation Department through the provision of aquatic program services and the operation of the Ravensong Aquatic Centre. This position supports the Recreation Department by assisting team members in their duties, as required, to meet service expectations, departmental goals and objectives.

PRIMARY DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES

- Provides direct hands-on leadership, including lifeguarding and instruction, in the provision of a wide range of aquatic programs in the Ravensong Aquatic Centre.
- Assists the Aquatic Programmer and Aquatic Team Leaders in the planning, organizing, and evaluating of aquatic recreation programs and events and leads/instructs a variety of water-based exercise classes.
- Performs a variety of administrative tasks including support and assistance of office staff, and maintenance of a variety
 of program reports and records.
- Plays a key role in the Aquatic Centre's customer service program including the development of a positive and friendly relationship with facility users of all ages.
- Performs a wide range of Aquatic Centre custodial and operational tasks including maintenance of pool water quality and equipment.
- Plays a key role in the Aquatic Centre's Safety Program, including provision of first aid services, enforcement of pool
 rules and pool safety for the public, routine preventative maintenance and safety checks, and implementation of the
 facility's emergency response program.
- Works varied hours as required.
- Performs other related duties as required.
