CURBSIDE ORGANICS COLLECTION

The RDN has expanded its curbside collection organics service. If you have a green-lidded cart with the RDN logo, you can now top it up with leaves, grass and light yard trimmings.

Please ensure:

- Only accepted items are placed in the organics cart
- Lids are closed and left in the unlocked position if the cart is over 75 per cent full
- Yard trimmings are no larger than 1.5 cm in diameter, an no longer than 60 cm in length
- Keep the lid completely closed
- If the cart is over 75 per cent full, leave the cart in the unlocked position

 Continue to set your carts out by 8 am until 6 pm in your typical collection location.

VISIBLE STREET ADDRESSES

It is crucial for homes to have visible street address signs to help emergency services find the right home quickly during an emergency, such as a fire or if someone needs medical attention. If your address isn't visible, the responders may have trouble finding the right home, wasting valuable

time. Visible addresses are important for day-to-day things too like receiving deliveries or visitors to your home. Visible address signs help keep the public safe and make sure everyone can find their way.

WATERING RESTRICTIONS

Stage 2 Watering Restrictions for automated sprinkling systems begin on May 1. This allows even or odd day watering based on house number, for a maximum of two hours between 7 and 10 a.m. or 7 and 10 p.m. This watering schedule comes into effect annually, helping everyone get in the habit of water conservation as we move into the summer months.

Please note: the Town of Qualicum Beach starts Stage 1 restrictions May 15, Deep Bay Improvement District and Qualicum Bay Horne Lake Waterworks currently have no restrictions, and Decourcey remains at stage 4 restrictions.
