24-041 Wastewater Grit and Screenings Hauling Services

Addendum 1

This addendum shall be read in conjunction with and considered as an integral part of the Request for Tenders. Revisions supersede the information contained in the original Request for Tenders. No consideration will be allowed for any extras due to any Proponent not being familiar with the contents of this Addendum. All other terms and conditions remain the same.

Questions and Answers

This following is a compilation of questions received from possible proponents up to 9:00 am on August 14, 2024, and the answers to these questions:

Q1. Are you able to confirm for the 10-yard bin that is hauled with both Screening and Grit at the FCPC, is there two separate compartments that the materials go into, or are they both mixed together in the bin?

A1. Screenings and grit are mixed together in the 10 cubic yard bin at FCPC.

Q2. Are there dimension requirements for the bin at FCPC, as there was none listed, but there were specifications made for the bins at GNPCC?

A2. Please see below the specifications for the 10 and 12 cubic yard bins:

10 cubic yard Roll Off Bins

- The specifications for the 10 cubic yard bins are the same at both GNPCC and FCPC. Both bins are used to collect screenings.
- Bins must be 7 feet (wide) by 10 feet (long) by at least 55 inches (4.6 ft) (tall). Bins must be compatible with the loading facilities and equipment at both GNPCC and FCPC.
- Bins must hold at least 10 cubic yards of material.

12 cubic yard Roll Off Bins:

- Bins must be 8 feet (wide) by 12 feet (long) by at least 4 ft height. Bins must be compatible with the loading facilities at GNPCC. Bins are used to collect grit at GNPCC.
- Bins must hold at least 12 cubic yards of material.

General Requirements

- Roll Off bins must have a lid that can be fully closed during transport. The lids must be able to be opened at the loading facility to allow bins to be filled while the bins are placed. The contractor must open this lid after delivering a new bin and close and secure the bin lid prior to transport.

Q3. Are we able to remove the pollution insurance requirement from the request, as our business has little to no risk of pollution.

A3. The RDN would like to keep the pollution insurance requirement.

Q4. 1. Rates have been requested for a new line item for “statutory holidays & weekends” The landfill is closed on statutory holidays, so would not be able to dump, would we need to hold the loaded bin at our facility till landfill opens?

2. If we were to have to haul on a weekend and the landfill is open, that’s not an issue, but the rate would be different then that of a stat day, where one can’t dump.

A4. Provide rates on the tender form for hauling on a weekend day when the landfill is open. Rates would not account for storage at an external facility.

Situations requiring holding the loaded bin at an external facility would be very infrequent, and thus handled on a “one-off” basis (i.e. negotiated outside of the agreement).

An addendum has been added to remove statutory holidays from the rates requested.
