RDN Launches TrailRider Pilot Program for the Summer

The Regional District of Nanaimo (RDN) has launched the TrailRider program to improve access to RDN parks. This program will help residents with mobility challenges to enjoy accessible trails within our region. The summer pilot program is running until the end of August 2025, with trained RDN staff providing orientation for TrailRider program participants. The program's success will be reviewed after the summer to explore possible expansion.

The TrailRider is a one-wheeled mobility device powered by two or more people that combines the features of a wheelchair and a rickshaw, enabling inclusive outdoor trail access. The TrailRider mobility device being used for the RDN pilot program was generously donated by local resident Murray Chantler who wants others to have the same opportunity he has had to explore trails.
