Watering Restrictions Lifted for most RDN Water Service Areas on November 1

Most Regional District of Nanaimo (RDN) Water Service Areas will be lifting watering restrictions at the end of the month. On November 1, all watering restrictions will be lifted except for the Decourcey and Surfside Water Service Areas which will remain at Stage 4 due to operational needs.

The recent rain has helped relieve drought conditions and reduced the seasonal water demand in our communities. Most systems annually end watering restrictions in November, as precipitation increases to seasonal norms.

The provincial drought rating for eastern Vancouver Island has eased, and stream flows are returning to normal levels for this time of year. Conserving water, however, is an important, year-round habit as drought conditions are coming earlier and lasting longer than in the past. The RDN thanks residents for doing their part to conserve water during the hot, dry summer we experienced. Reducing non-essential water use helped retain water for our aquatic environments, fire protection and essential household use.
