#### **1. Existing Data, Fieldwork Purpose and Scope**

All existing spatial data available and relevant to this project is available publicly through provincial spatial data services, with additional information available in the following documents:

The expectation is that fieldwork will provide a baseline dataset for wildfire risk in parks, rather than simply filling minor gaps in existing data. Field assessments are required to identify the current conditions of RDN Parks as they relate to wildfire. These may include but are not limited to:

- Wildfire risk assessments in vegetated areas and Wildland Urban Interface zones.
- Hazard assessments for park infrastructure and buildings.

#### **2. Budgeting and Funding**

The project has a maximum budget of **\$70,000 & GST**. It is not funded through grant programs, including the BC Climate Resilience Investment Program.

### **3. Fuel Management**

Should there be locations recommended for fuel treatment, they must be identified spatially as polygons. In-field layout is not required. Only general details on purpose, priority and next steps need to be provided

### **4. Engagement with Interested and Affected Parties**
