



VOTER REGISTRATION DOCUMENTS

Voters who are not on the list of electors must produce at least two (2) documents that provide evidence of identity and place of residence, at least one (1) of which must contain your signature. This is a requirement for both Resident Electors, and Non-Resident Property Electors.

Examples of acceptable ID include the following:

- a BC Driver's Licence;
- a BC Identification Card such as
 - a photo BC services card;
 - a non-photo BC services card;
- a Certificate of Indian Status (issued by the Government of Canada);
- a Citizenship or membership card issued by a First Nation;
- a Citizenship card issued by Métis Nation British Columbia;
- an ICBC Owner's Certificate of Insurance and Vehicle License;
- a BC CareCard or BC Gold CareCard;
- a Ministry of Social Development and Economic Security Request for Continued Assistance Form SDES8 (now Monthly Report HR0081);
- a Social Insurance Number card or confirmation of Social Insurance Number letter issued by the government of Canada;
- a Citizenship Card;
- a property tax notice;
- a credit card or debit card; or
- a utility bill (such as electricity, natural gas, water, telephone or cable services).

The above listed identification documents **MUST** be accepted by election officials. An election official may also accept other forms of documents that provide evidence satisfactory to the election official (e.g., a valid, current passport).
