## REGIONAL DISTRICT OF NANAIMO 2021-2025 REVISED FINANCIAL PLAN

#### Introduction

- The 2021-2025 Proposed budget was presented in November and approved in December.
- Updates in the revised budget include:
  - 2020 Actual balances
  - Carry-Forward amounts
  - 2021 Assessment
  - BC Transit 3 Year Draft Budget
  - Final Municipal Parcel Count
  - Arrowsmith Water Service Joint Venture
  - External costs for other jurisdictions Northern Community Sports Field Agreement, 911



#### New Items

- Reallocate IT funds for Temporary Technician position to support COVID requirements.
- \$12,500 to GIS for additional software cost to update web map interface.
- \$75,000 for an IT security audit, funded by the COVID-19 Safe Restart Grant.
- \$221,700 for GNPCC additional Treatment Materials.
- \$10,118 for EV Charging Stations.
- \$75,000 to District 68 E911 to relocate infrastructure located at Nanaimo Firecomm.
- \$15,000 to District 68 E911 to relocate the Cottle Hill Repeater radio connection.
- \$13,700 to Northern Community Wastewater for flow meter and sensor in Oualicum Beach.
- \$112,500 to Transit for infrastructure exploratory agreements/facilities master.

The new items listed above have no impact on the tax requisition as the increases are being funded either by reductions in expenses or by other sources of funding (i.e. grant funding, reserve funding or additional surplus carried forward from 2020).



#### **Amendments**

- Additional \$10,000 to the Bus shelters for the Transit Minor Betterment Program.
  - This project was approved at the December 8, 2020 Board meeting.
  - The revised Project cost is \$150,000 funded fully by grants.

#### **COVID-19 Safe Restart Grants**

- On November 19th, the RDN received \$1,169,000 from the Province for COVID-19 Safe Restart funding.
- Additionally, \$4,601,125 was received from BC Transit exclusively for transit use.
- All Board motions related to the allocation of grant funds have been incorporated in the revised 2021-2025 Financial Plan.
- These motions include payments to external organizations including Mountain, Cranberry and Gabriola Fire Protection Districts, Deep Bay and North Cedar Improvement Districts, Gabriola Community Bus Foundation, and Arrowsmith, Nanaimo and Lighthouse Country Search & Rescue organizations.



### Legislative Requirements

The Local Government Act provides the following legislative requirements:

- A Financial Plan must be adopted by Bylaw before March 31 each year
- The Financial Plan must be for a 5-year Period
- The Financial Plan must include Public Consultation

The RDN has 107 service areas, each treated as their own entity.

Meaning any surplus stays with that service and funds cannot be transferred from one service area to another.

NRHD is governed by separate legislation. The NRHD provisional budget was approved in December and the Revised budget will be presented on February 23, 2021.



### **Requisition Comparison**

The current economic climate was a key factor in the preparation of this Financial Plan.

The proposed 2021 budget has a total tax requisition of \$65.3 million, \$2.2 million less than proposed for 2021 in the previous budget cycle, representing a reduction of 3.4% overall compared to the 2020-2024 Financial Plan.





### **2021 Capital Projects**


- Projects previously approved by the Board and in-progress have rolled forward into the 2021 budget. These projects form part of the bylaw and do not require further Board approval.






2021 Total Cost for the average City of Parksville home (\$503,309) = \$693


2021 Total Cost for the average **Town of Qualicum Beach** home (\$637,399) = **\$805**




2021 Total Cost for the average **Electoral Area B** home (\$449,037) = **\$422**


2021 Total Cost for the average **Electoral Area C** home (\$700,256) = **\$710**


2021 Total Cost for the average Electoral Area E home (\$824,946) = \$780


2021 Total Cost for the average **Electoral Area F** home (\$473,181) = **\$600**


2021 Total Cost for the average **Electoral Area G** home (\$657,246) = **\$837**
