



2026 Stewardship Seed Funding Information

RDN DWWP Stewardship Seed Funding supports environmental stewardship organizations within the region to complete restoration, enhancement, and research projects. These projects rehabilitate and monitor our local watersheds while protecting both the ecological and economic values of our natural systems.

ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS:

- Projects must:
 - be located within the RDN, including electoral areas (A, B, C, E, F, G, H) and member municipalities (Nanaimo, Lantzville, Parksville, Qualicum Beach),
 - be led by a not-for-profit organization,
 - actively enhance the stream health, hydrology, and/or function,
 - involve volunteers,
 - be jointly funded by other partners, donors, and/or include in-kind contributions,
 - acquire all necessary permissions and permits to complete work at project site, and
 - not have received funding for three consecutive years.
- Multi-year projects can apply annually for up to three consecutive years, after the third year of funding the project is ineligible for funding for that following year. After a one-year grace period to allow others to access funds, the project is eligible to apply for funding again for up to three consecutive years.
- All work, including purchasing of supplies and materials, must be completed in the same calendar year that the pre-approval and claim form are submitted.
- Pre-approval applications can be submitted for 2026 between January 30th and December 15th 2026, or until funds for the calendar year are exhausted. Apply early to ensure your project will be considered for funding.

AWARDING PROCESS: Seed funding, between \$1,000 - \$10,000, is awarded by the RDN Drinking Water and Watershed Protection program based on the merit of the application and how it matches current program priorities. Apply early, limited funds are available each year. It will be announced when funding is exhausted for the year, visit www.rdn.bc.ca/stewardship-seed-funding for program status.

PRE-APPROVAL AND CLAIMS: Apply for pre-approval to “reserve” funds for eligible projects. Once the application is approved, funding will be allocated for that calendar year. Claim forms and supporting documentation must be received by December 15th, 2026. The RDN reserves the right to inspect or verify sites prior to pre-approval or issuance of funds, and applicant contacts may receive project status communications before, during, or after project completion.
